CENTENARY PROJECT

- The £3.5 million project - launched in 2013 and completed in 2017 - included a full refurbishment of its Grade A listed building
- Project aim was to sympathetically remodel the building while improving energy efficiency. It was designed by architects, Burrell Foley Fischer.
- Funding: National Lottery, Heritage Lottery Fund, Coastal Communities Fund, Highlands and Islands, Historic Environment Scotland, Argyll & Bute Council, Robertson Trust, Architectural Heritage, Foyle Foundation, Pilgrim Trust and Awards For All
- RBS Social and Community Capital provided upfront capital so work could begin before grant funding could be claimed

PRIORITIES & IMPROVEMENTS

A feasibility study was conducted to determine the most suitable environmental improvements to include in the overall project design, within the confines of the building's Category A listed status.

The cinema also availed of Energy Business Scotland's building audit service which helped to prioritise energy interventions during planning.

Green capital investment:

- LED lighting
- Improvement of insulation
- Solar panels
- Biomass boiler
